Qualifying benefits for most Jobcentre Plus programmes

For most Jobcentre Plus programmes:

Normally, people must have been unemployed and in receipt (as a claimant or as a dependant) of a qualifying benefit for a specific period of time (usually six months).

A qualifying benefit is:

- *Jobseekers Allowance, including NI credits only*
- *Incapacity Benefit*
- *Severe Disablement Allowance*
- *Income Support*
- *Maternity Benefit*

Early entry may be applicable (see below) in some cases but is not an automatic entitlement; a Jobcentre Plus adviser will judge whether the programme is the most appropriate form of help.

New Deal for Disabled People - eligibility

The job seeker must be in receipt of one of the following qualifying benefits (people between 17 and 65 could be eligible):

- Incapacity Benefit; or
- Severe Disablement Allowance; or
- National Insurance Credits on the grounds of incapacity (which may be awarded on their own or in addition to payments of income related benefits - Income support, Housing Benefit, Council Tax Benefit - or War Pensions; or
- Income Support with a disability premium; or IS pending the result of an appeal against disallowance from IB; or
- Disability Living Allowance where the recipient is not in receipt of JSA, and is not in paid work of 16 hours or more per week; or
- Housing Benefit with a disability premium, or Council Tax Benefit with a disability premium, provided the recipient is not in receipt of Jobseeker's Allowance, and is not in paid work of 16 hours or more per week; or
- WP with an Unemployability Supplement; or
- Industrial Injuries Disablement Benefit with an Unemployability Supplement.
- A benefit equivalent to Incapacity Benefit that has been imported into Great Britain under the European Community Regulations on the co-ordination of social security and the terms of the European Economic Area Agreement (see Appendix 1).

If entitlement to a qualifying benefit ceases then the customer will become ineligible to participate in NDDP
